Happy May everyone! I am in love with watching everything turn green and start to bloom and blossom. It is the promise of a fresh start for an amazing 2021 Season at the OLC!

We have an exciting update for our members. OLC has just reached 238 memberships! From what I have been told and been able to find, this is the highest our membership count has been in many years. This is in large due to our members. You have talked to your friends about your love of the club, and this has resonated with your friends and family. We express our deepest thanks! We have several other inquiries and hope to report that we have reached the 240 mark very soon.

One of the ways we are hoping to make more people aware of just who we are and what the OLC has to offer is through our social media accounts. We will be having a Marketing/Social Media Intern as a part of the team this season who will work closely with Maddy to put exciting, brand-specific posts out on the web, social media accounts, texts, and the emails that go to our membership. We could use our member's assistance with this by; following, liking, commenting, and engaging with our posts. This helps our social media pages get more time in front of people within our area.

If you do not follow us, please use the links below to become one of our "friends". If you like something we post, push the like button, or comment. During this past winter season, the team has been hard at work looking at areas where we can save money for the club, as well as the membership.

Chef Nancy, her team, and I have put in many hours to review the costs associated with the products that are brought into the club and prepared for the membership. We have entered into a new relationship with a food house and are happy to let the membership know that you will be seeing price savings on average of 18%+ on approximately 50% of the menu items offered. This is based solely on the price we are paying for products.

It does not mean that the membership will be seeing smaller portions. In addition to this, we are looking at

exciting, fun offerings such as "specialty nights" for the members once we are down in Dockside for the season. Keep your eyes open for emails on what is coming for our 2021 season!

A new page you will find in the membership directory is the room rental fees for our members for their private dining/parties. Members of OLC are given these rates at 50% of the cost to non-members. Reservations for the Terrace, Library, Great Hall, or Commodore will need to be made a minimum of 7 days in advance to allow for adequate staffing and menu planning should be done with our events person.

Each day we are getting closer to having the member portal, as well as reservation systems (tennis and dining) available for our member use. Once we have been able to test all of the systems, a detailed tutorial on the usage of these systems will be sent out to our members. We think you will like the ease of placing reservations, as well as seeing your club charges in real-time and the ease in which you can pay your statement online.

Mother's Day is right around the corner and we are thankful to all of the members and their families that will be joining us that day, especially all of our wonderful mothers! We are over a week out and our reservations are full and are currently on a waiting list. Here's to getting back, a little, to "normal".



A NOTE FROM JUD

Dear OLC Members,

As my time has come to an end after 10 years of being your Tennis Director, I wish to thank everyone for a truly wonderful experience working at OLC. It has been an honor and privilege to direct a program with so much tennis history and so many great people who really care for the great sport of tennis. I wish to thank Tammy Laing who was the Tennis Chairperson when I was hired. I think I knew right away that she represented a group of people that I could build strong friendships with. I remember meeting at her house with the tennis committee and that was the first time I met Barb Schulz. It did not take long for me to recognize what a special person Barb was and how much she loved OLC.



Barb was a true historian for the club and very protective of the past, present and future of OLC. A truly kind person.

I will always remember my trips in every morning. I would pass through the

little town of Eagle and read the daily specials at The Hen House diner and pass through the beautiful Kettle Moraine area. When I would enter the Oconomowoc Lake area I always loved looking out on the water on my drive around. It was a very peaceful way to begin my day. Sometimes the water would be very smooth and tranquil and almost foreshadowed a calm and peaceful day at the club. Other times the water could be a bit choppy and maybe indicated perhaps a more challenging day. Maybe it would be one of those days when all the mowers, blowers, weed whippers, chainsaws etc., would be out in force and was harder to hear on the courts. Or maybe some weather was going to play a factor in the day. But either way I loved looking out at the water on my drive. And during the off season when I would periodically come to the club, how different things seemed with the fall and the winter. Water can truly run the range of emotions from energy to melancholy.

One of the things I was taught early on in my career in the private club industry was the importance of building a true tennis community within your club. A community that serves all ages and abilities. To do this you had to be very active in all group activities and create more of them and to build strong relationships and trust within those groups. Giving private lessons most certainly is an important component of being a tennis professional, but



the most important component are the group activities. As your Tennis Director, in all ten years I never missed a group activity and never took myself out of a group activity even if the attendance

was light. The relationships in those groups were just too important and essential to building a strong tennis community. Even in our youngest kids programs, I never missed a class. The bond you would establish that would serve their passage through the junior program over the years began at the beginning. This past year when I had Will Young, Ben Brandel and Cameron Holahan working with the young Quick Start kids it represented a complete cycle for them because all 3 of them started out themselves in those classes years ago. The relationships I had with those 3 boys over the years would never have been as strong had I not spent the time with them early on. And on the adult side, in addition to the group drills and Ladies Hackers, we started TNTT. Not only was it a huge success on its own but it paved the way for an expanding Saturday morning and the resurrection of some very important traditional tournaments and events. The OLC tennis community was on its way. I want to thank everyone and especially the captains who made TNTT a truly fun night and season of tennis.

I also learned very early on in my career the importance of maintaining the traditions that have been passed down thru the years that in a sense keeps the history of the club intact and alive. When I was the Director of Tennis at Northmoor Country Club down in Illinois, where I was for 20 years, I inherited a trophy for the Men's Singles Championship called the Ray Anthony

Trophy. I never met
Ray Anthony as he
had passed on before
my time, but I met his
wife and children and
grandchildren who
would journey from
California each summer
in August to come
watch the finals of the
men's singles. I knew
this was important to
the Anthony family





and to the club.
I also knew that
participation was
declining and that
I had to take steps
to bring it back and
I did. The Anthony
family were very
appreciative of my
efforts and would
always call me early
in the summer

to let me know when in August they would be coming back and I would arrange the tournament finals around that date. You know, in 20 years of umpiring that finals match we never got rained out. Ray Anthony may have been looking down at us. When I came to OLC, I met Mary Read and she showed me all of the trophies for all the club championships and events and gave me the history behind them. I loved her passion for this club history and I knew just like the Anthony Trophy that this was very important. I also saw similar to Northmoor CC that participation was trending down and I needed to fix that. In time I think Mary realized I cared for these trophies and what they represented and I was determined to preserve them. To do this I had to bring them into the tennis community we were establishing and change some of the formats to re-energize them. In some cases it broke from some traditions but the end result was a preservation of their relevance in the summer tennis calendar. I so appreciate Mary's friendship and support over these past 10 years and love the dedication the Read family brings to the history of the club. Unfortunately, I only had one summer with Marion Read before she passed on. It was my honor to hit balls with her once a week that summer. She was a great champion, great ambassador for the sport and a great person. The friendships I developed with Ross and Mary and Tom and Lisa mean a lot to me.

I also want to recognize the teaching staff I had over these past 10 years. I had a lot of truly great young teaching assistants that really added to the culture of the OLC tennis community. And, of course, during my first few summers it was a lot of fun having my coaching partner at Marquette, Steve Rodecap, helping out. It must be noted that Marquette was very good

to me in allowing me to give so much of my summers to OLC. I also will forever appreciate the groundskeepers Rick and Kevin. I really looked forward to seeing them each day



and they do a great job at OLC. I have been blessed over my career by many great groundskeepers. I am reminded each day when I look out my bedroom window at a beautiful maple tree of a man named Ernie Tripp who was my first groundskeeper back at Northmoor CC. Ernie was an older widowed man who was as rock solid as they come. My wife and I became



very close to Ernie. One day when I arrived at work he flagged me down from his golf cart and gave me 2 little pots with what looked like weeds but were actually a couple of maple seedlings. We planted them in our back yard and 35 years later we have 2 huge "Ernie" maple trees. After working with Ernie for 15 years, one day when I got to work Ernie wasn't there and it was the first time I had ever seen him miss a day of work. Ernie had gotten a couple of blood clots in his legs and was diagnosed with advanced pancreatic cancer. He would never return to work and I would go see him after work but he deteriorated very quickly. 6 weeks after he was diagnosed Ernie passed away. But we still have our maple trees in our back yard as a reminder of this truly wonderful man. These are the kind of memories that are most important to me.

There are so many of you that I would like to thank in this letter by name but if I do I will leave important people out and I don't want to do that. Those people for whom I had a great relationship with and appreciated the efforts I put in to build an active tennis community at OLC, you know who you are and how much your support meant to me. There is a great book called, "Leave Better than Found", and I feel at peace knowing that I am leaving OLC better than I found it. With great energy and enthusiasm from all of you we accomplished so much and the foundation is solid for years and generations to come. I also learned early on in my career that despite your best efforts that you can never be everything to everybody. You can only hope that you can be as much as possible to as many as possible. I wish all of you the very best for many active years playing tennis at OLC. I won't forget you and I am confident that our paths will cross again.


